At Lord's Hill

UPSET and clearly agitated, a young Royal Marine com-mando rushed into Warminster police station on Monday morning and told an amazing story of his meeting with a glowing object near Lords Hill, three miles from Warminster, at about I a.m. as he was travelling by car on the A350 between the A303 and the hill.

He had been driving for about one hour and had not been drinking.

PC Bernard Hollands said on Monday afternoon: "He was extremely frightened and un-nerved by his unusual experi-ence and encounter with the unknown. He gave his name and address, which we have on file—he is based in Ar-broath—but he asked us not

to reveal them for publication as he fears people will laugh at him. He was genu-inely bewildered by what had happened".

he witness apparently knew nothing of Warminster's repu-tation for Flying Saucers; apparently knew which have been reported over the past 11 years. He suddenly noticed that his car was being pursued by a bright red and glowing light, which appeared to have come from a field to the offside of the road and was bobbing alongside his vehicle. The car headlights went out, the sidelamps flickered, and the engino began to mistire, he reported to the constable on duty. This continued for sev-

eral seconds-until the globe of light seemed to float away, to vanish in a downward direction.

There was no sound associated with the sighting of the object. The commando, aged 22, hopes never to have a similar frightening experience. It is perhaps apt that this prelude came a few days before a large skywatch arranged for Thursday at Starr Hill, War-minster, where a number of Americans were keeping watch from 10 p.m. to dawn next day.
