We tend to credit that there is virtually no life on other spheres in our solar system; yet is it not more likely that there is none of the sort we know and are familiar with? People would be more willing to accept such manifestations as UNOs once this was established firmly and without doubt, scientifically certain and verified.

Countless UFO sightings have been reported worldwide, for these flying phenomena are no respecters of individuals, races, creeds, ideologies and nations when it comes to general visual involvement. Many other experiences have been hesitantly mentioned yet not publicly revealed, with testifiers fearing ridicule. Yet reports naturally rely on strict integrity of witnesses; so surely there are now so many that stand up to interrogation as wholly accurate and trustworthy?

It needs moral courage of a pretty high order to withstand heavy injections of irony and sarcasm; and even the biggest imbeciles and thickest-hided of extroverts hate being laughed at! Ill-concealed sniggers of officialdom can be hurtful to the teller of absolute truth: and what about the snide remarks re poor eyesight, suspect temperament and over-vivid imagination?

Luminous

A luminous crimson light, shaped like a flare without a smoke-trail, was reported to police at Aldridge, who confirmed that others had seen it, too, some 500 feet above a hill range. The official explanation?

This, as is often the case, fell far short of reality...It was probably lights warning of an aircraft, as Barr Beacon is situated below an Elmdon Airport flight path. Yet complete absence of sound ruled that out effectively. Still, any excuse is better than none...

Fiction Today, Fact Tomorrow

Today's science-fiction is often a distorted reflection of the future...luch news smacks of past literature. Test-tube baby experiments were forseen in the Brave New World of Aldous Huxley. While the perspicacity of Ver

in his Journey to the Loon foresaw space craft and space suits. He also foretold the advent of submarines in his 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea...H. G. Wells wrote about tanks before those massive armoured machines first terrified German Soldiers in World War 1.

Time travel is a popular ingredient in fiction, the prospect of life complete with 4th-dimensional potential perhaps not so very far distant. Lental telepathy and extrasensory perception may in future become a highly developed part of life on Earth.

People already lay claim to picking up thought-waves or ether vibrations of others far away. There have been striking instances of disaster predicted by people nowhere near scenes of tragedy. Pre-cognitive experiences and fateful dream sequences are recorded in history, but remain a giant puzzle to science and leading thinkers.

Only a relatively small portion of total brain capacity and potential is used by us. Experiments involving mental telepathy to and from Russian and American undersea craft are apparently more than a modern fad or novel joke...So many lost truths have to be discovered or found anew.

A Welsh Saucer Sighting

A shrewd eye for detail gives authenticity to this sighting by Frs. S. Birchall, of Llysfaem, who might easily have witnessed this particular type of phenomenon at Warminster. She wondered if anyone else in her Welsh district noticed an unusual aerial object at midnight of a July night in 1975:

'I live in a particularly elevated spot and, when putting the dog out just after midnight, I could not fail to see a large starlike object shining brilliantly golden amid the weak greeny light of the stars. It was about two-thirds of the distance between Betws-yn-Rhos and Rhyd-y-Foel; nearer the latter...

'Observed through binoculars it seemed to be turning as it varied between what looked like a clock-face, an ellipse and then a completely sideways view of a circle. It faced towards the sea all the time and seemed to have a projection like a nose in the centre of the circle; and

behing were flames spreading out like hair... These were reddish, but the front part was very bright orange yellow, with several dark marks resembling square windows.

'The aeroform was rough-looking, not smooth, and seen without the aid of binoculars it was as if it had a tail at the base...It was much bigger and brighter than the stars around. It was a clear night, no moon that plenty of stars. Everything everywhere was very still and the object did not seem to be making much progress towards the rea, although it moved that way when viewed through the binoculars. It was so remarkable, to me!

A Few Implications...

'How does the corner stone at Cuzco in the high Andes, 12,000 feet above sea level and weighing over two million four hundred thousand pounds, sit there in that wall in an area where earthquakes are common? Yet the thinnest razor blade cannot be inserted between the stones:

'There is no system of hydraulics that could lift a stone of that weight even to this day, raise it and set it in place 12,000 feet up into the air; while below it in the same locale is the sister stone, cut in the quarry there, unraised...

*This is prima facie evidence that people who put that stone there knew the basic principles of levitation. I believe, and am satisfied with the evidence, that great segments of our world population were removed at the same time as the stoppage of great works in Cambodia, Baalbeck and other areas throughout the world where ruins stand silent today as to the peoples who built them...

'One world-famed man bearing my name, bewton, said that the atom was an indivisible unit of the universe. Three hundred years later it was established that he was wrong. We finally split the atom, an object so small that no scientific eye has ever seen it. We have not yet developed an instrument that can see it, yet we have learned a lot about it.

"When we first found that an atom contained am electron, the thought came into scientific minds that here was something to change the status of the atom as an indivisible unit of the universe. Then we found the proton, the meson and all the different related things. What, then, did we discover?

'That they were spinning bodies, and that a spinning body develops a north and south pole and functions with its spinning rate as a magnet. It is reasonable that peoples of other planets, when they felt the shock-waves from the bomb that was set off at Alamogordo and other test sites, were alerted. The bombs which have been set off successfully since then have further disturbed the balance of planets throughout our solar system. We are already noting abnormal changes; for example, in our atmospheric conditions and in other instances.'

Dater in his speech, after theorising on principles of propulsion that alien spacecraft may employ, hr. hewton said he was happy to welcome them and their crews, 'And I am convinced that their purpose is to help the peoples of the Earth to make this world a better place to live in.

'Not only that: to make possible co-operation of peoples of other worlds with peoples of this world.. We are moving into a 4th-dimensional universe, regardless of what any of us may think. The space age is upon us and we of this world stand, with bated breath day after tay, looking across the horizon to the future with great hope!'

Shades of the Past?

An impressive little mound near Warminster railway station is Cop Heap. It was formerly bare, the trees planted by order of the Harquess of Bath in fairly recent years. It is a conical hill, crowned by a prehistoric barrow of considerable height, with a bank and a ditch.

This burial mound was opened in 1809 by archaeologist Sir Richard Colt-Hoare and on the SW side he
found, at a depth of only two feet, the skeleton of a
man, some pieces of worked flint and fragments of
stag horns...

On the west side was unearthed another skeleton three feet down; and on the north a kist or coped grave containing the remains of a woman with an infant by her side, some ivory beads and a seashell. Lodern historian Wilfred Liddlebrook tells us it was the scene of many a pagen ceremony in prehistoric times, such as the burial of an ancient British chief and his queen on the summit.

*Cn Palm Sunday, it is said, the devil leaves Cop
Heap in the form of a fox and roams the downs on evil
bent... This reminds me of an event involving animals
at Cradle Hill at about 3.20 one Sunday morning. We saw
an unwinking UFO at quite close range after we had crunched our way through snow two feet deep around the cops

Among several witnesses were Mick Taylor, then guitarist with the prominent pop group, the Rolling Stones led by Mick Jagger; some American friends of the Stones a catering assistant for Dover ferry services, Angela Rickett; Lynne Moore from Hampshire; Ken Masterton, a Pembrokeshire technician with a television firm; and young students from a college in Oxfordshire.

In the roseate glare of the UFO light we all saw a friendly 'intruder' among sheep on the hillside, the farm animals huddled together for extra warmth in freezing weather that January. It nestled among them comfortably, practically rubbing shoulders with their woollen coats...

It even shared their drinking water where ice had been removed from a trough by a thoughtful young Ufologist. Thinking it was a wild dog, cowed and tamed by severe wintry conditions, we fed it scraps of food and portions of chocolate.

Then, as the flaring halo of the UFO brightened the scene on the hilltop, we discerned that this was no ordinary canine. It had a magnificent sweep of russet-red brush as a tail. It was a fox! Yet it had fed quite contentedly from one person's hand at one juncture...

Of course, this has no bearing on or connection with the legend of Cop Heap, but it impressed all witnesses as quite remarkable that one of the traditional enemies of sheep was lying with them to rain shelter from bitin coldness on snow-crusted countryside near a remote clump of trees.

The night air was chill and still, the copse locali suddenly warm and friendly in the wake of the UFO-bath atmosphere. We spotted two other possible UFOs at a distance and high overhead during the sky-watch, like skitterin mosquitoes when bround to bear unter the

pair of powerful binoculars brought along by Kent enthusiast Angela...

Barrows and tumuli abount in Warminster area on heights ringing the town, sepulchral mounds dating from prehistoric times. The long barrow in a plantation on the southern slope of Arm Hill, opened in 1803, was found to contain three skeletons.

An extra-large mound known as King Barrow was opened at Boreham in 1800. The huge circular barrow at the summit of Cley Hill is a landmark for miles around. The Hife of Lan Barrow at Cannimore is particularly charming because of its unique situation: the dark, sombre backcloth of the woods emphasising the isolation of this tree-crested hummock.

Historian Danley said of this barrow that it occupied a site that would allow signalling to and from most of the prehistoric camps in the district. A few yards down the field is a circular black earth patch unaffected by ploughing. It might well have been the site of Celtic ceremonial fires.

It is sometimes called Dead Man's Island, an imposing and picturesque burial mound sited at the centre of a large field, crested by beautiful firs. From here there must have been a clear and uninterrupted view of surrounding heights, including lofty Tley Till, before the Carmimore firs were planted, I owadays it is but another intriguing name on the map of Warminster, with Dead Man's Island lingering in memories of older residents to other with odd place names such as:

Beggar's Bush, Black Hedge, Kittle Alley, Up the Leg and Down the Stocking, Leg and Battles, Black Sammy, Mount Skipit, Vipers Island, Mount Hemett, Rocky Daddy, Alf Lane (down which a spectral funeral often passed long a o), and Bugley, which according to Harley was known to earlier British folk as Pouques-Lea or Mairyland, with Puck for their leader...

Beneath the large mound spanning Cley Will peak dwelt a spirit who visited Bugley by flowing along the streamlet until it reached Hoa's Well. This is endowed with the property of healing weak eyes, according to lanley. But nearer Gradle Will is where much of the UPO activity takes place.
