



Editorial - The Good, The Bad & the Ugly.

Old friends who have been with us for some time will recall the ups and downs of the Centre as hinted at in the Journal. These reflect the progress and setbacks that we have journeyed through since the early days of our beginning in 1975. People, time and projects have come and gone, results achieved, policies changed; the world changing with every turn, lessons learnt and so to move on.
I feel maybe we owe it to you to inform you briefly of the deeper issues with regard the Centre and the background to our immediate future policy.

First, we have made tremendous advances in our understanding of the world in which we live, the other worlds in space and time and their relationship to this beautiful but sorry planet. We have now various sources of direct, and intermittent communication sources with people who have much wider experience of the true nature of the real situations involved. On the public relations front we have excellent connections in TV, publishing, media and administration both in the United Kingdom, the United States, and in the Free World, [in which we believe].

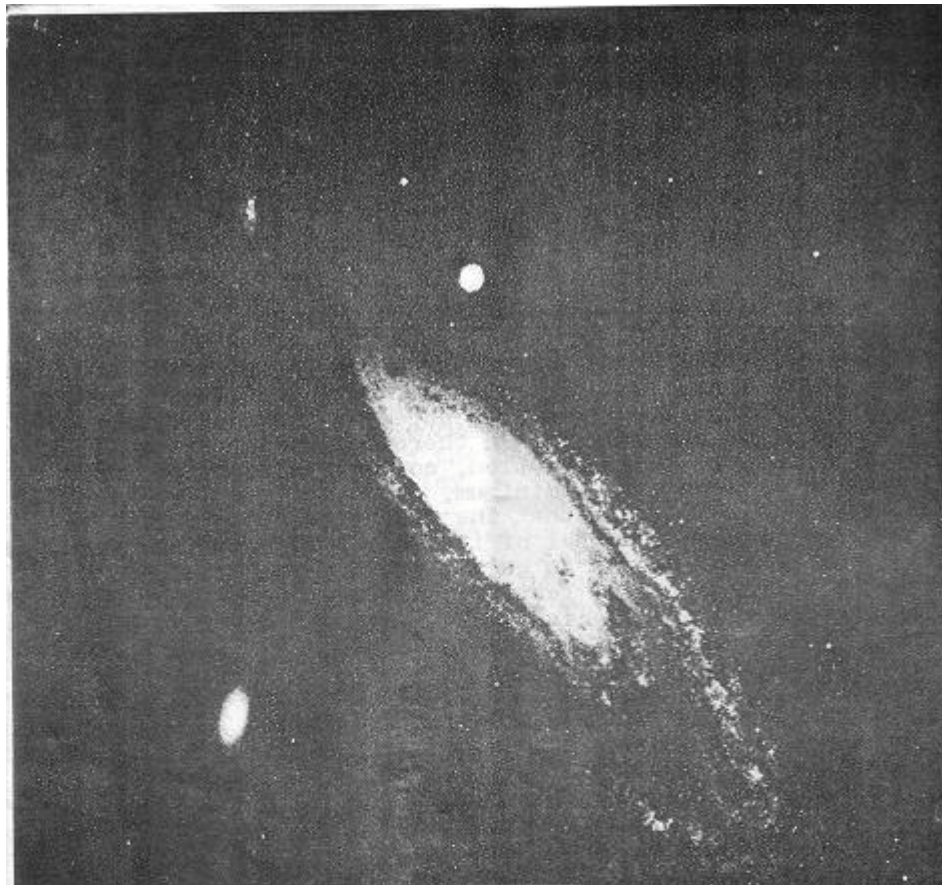
The objectives that we seek are the dissemination of beneficial knowledge at two levels. A public level [exoteric] via the Journal and to the Affiliated Members; and the more responsible level [esoteric] to those Associate Members, persons involved in administration, science & medicine, who have the experience to operate wisely and for the ultimate progress of free men. The nature of the world being as it is, competition and one upmanship, of man over man, nation over nation, social groups over others, hostilities arise and cold, cool and hot warfare can develop. For this reason all dangerous knowledge must be treated with trust, responsibility and moral regard to its use. In our policy of restraint, of not telling all to everyone, we have come under constant and severe attack. Who seeks to know must first prove to be wise enough to be given knowledge and know when not to use it. The exoteric is always fighting to invade and take over the esoteric. This it can never do for it does not perceive the nature of the division necessary.

There is of course another faction who fear knowledge by virtue of their position of ignorance, misguided belief, or because it would affect their 'superior' position. From all these negative elements the Centre and our staff, also people making public un-diplomatic information have been under insidious and childish pressure to prevent our work continuing. Although our legal advisors inform us that action could effectively be taken against certain identified elements who have not only broken the civil but also the criminal laws, and the measures to protect the security of the free world, it has been chosen upon to follow a policy of non-aggression, to take no action directly against this attack but with our up to date information of their intentions to merely to prevent their plans coming to fulfilment by always being ahead of them. I am certain that the infiltration of responsible positions in society by extremist elements is noted by the administrations of the UK & USA and they remain there only under the sufferance of our democratic administration, content to restrict their disruptive influence to a minimum.

Unfortunately this means that the Centre has been forced to take a complete reappraisal of its long term position, security and deployment of funds. As we are not prepared to accept pressure by phone calls, letters, and 'spy' campaigns, it has been regrettably found necessary to close our doors on all comers. Fountain Centre HQ, Warminster is now closed to the general public, and information services are limited to FCA members only. All Summer School Activities have been cancelled and persons seeking accomodation for mid-summer 77 should make alternative arrangements. Star House will continue for as long as possible and then be sold, at which time some further accomodation may be possible. Fountain House (Star Lodge) has been abandoned as a Summer School Centre, and we have written off the £700 already invested in the scheme. This severe loss is a direct result of outside pressure to stop our work.

The Fountain Journal will continue, operating from Warminster, and so will the branches of the FCA, and their own newsletters, run and financed by their own members. Fountain Centre will continue in an expanded form operating as a central information channel for the FCA, and collection of data, research, and distribution of arteles to press and media, and publishing. The inner circle of the Fountain Centre will continue as an esoteric organisation, protective of its associates trust and continuing to assist, and influence to beneficial ends the policies of understanding, goodwill and brotherhood which we have always displayed. We should warn members of the negative efforts of those elements opposed to these objectives.

Editors Preface: Fountain Journal has been fortunate to have been contacted by a man who through his constant communication with personalities from beyond this Earth has brought to us a remarkable archive of detailed knowledge, much of which checks out against our other hard won understanding. The years of work involved are being made public in a book which it is hoped to see published in 1978, but in the mean time we have obtained permission to serialise the book in the Journal, and although this will take many months, it is full of very accurate detail and is not the woolly material which has become associated with this type of contact. The book is being slightly re-written from its original form which is often too complicated to appreciate, but as much of the original script is being retained. This new series replaces 'The Times of Man' as its information follows on in far greater colour that area of enquiry. The book at the moment is without a title and we commence in this edition with the author's preface:.....

The work is by Terry Smith.

"The Eagle has landed!"

These words, expressed by astronaut Neil Armstrong on the occasion of the Apollo Moon-landing, may prove to have a far greater significance than Mankind can presently fathom.

For me, the story begins in 1953 when I was faintly beginning to appreciate that, behind all the normal senses of life, some thing was moving. The arts of E.S.P. pointed to a state of existence, invisible yet concrete, being conducted by people who had apparently "died".

Studying this phenomena, I became more and more aware that a process of life was functioning behind a veil of invisibility. From the point of awareness to the point of actually "seeing" through the veil is, I suppose, just a stage in the unfolding of that which is termed in certain circles as Mediumship.

I became, therefore, a Medium - a person who can consciously see and speak with peoples of an invisible world.

One can almost grade the invisible world into a sectional pattern, classifying each section according to the mental nature and outlook of its inhabitants. In and through all the sectional patterns, however, one can trace the movement of wonderful Souls who appear to act as teachers within the sections.

Thus I found myself with a Teacher who began to take on the position of adviser and unveiler of that strange invisible world commonly known as the Spirit World.

Within a short time, the experience of moving within the invisible world, with senses alive and alert, became almost a

- 10 - natural sequence. There were at first, naturally, moments of alarm when moving away from my physical body.

Through the years this process of visiting the invisible world and appreciating its sights and beautiful buildings made me feel that I was enjoying the best of two worlds and brought with it a keener sense of being "alive".

This feeling of being "alive" formed the basis of experience for out of it there slowly built up a new form of awareness - a Cosmic Consciousness - when I became aware of energies and forces impinging upon the physical world and began to appreciate their relationship with the invisible world as well as with other worlds of a Planetary design.

Perhaps it was this state of Planetary awareness which triggered off the following experience.

It was during the Spring of 1966, while living on the outskirts of Edinburgh, that I first became conscious that a new Intelligence was impinging thoughts into my mind. With some degree of difficulty two scripts were received and recorded from one who called himself Bartemus. This was followed by a short communication explaining that, as complete telepathic rapport did not exist between us, a replacement would be made.

It was about this time that news of a "Flying Saucer" sighting was reported near my home. Whether or not this was relevant to the coming of Dionthus, I do not know, but the following day I became conscious of a presence within our home.

It was then that I saw him for the first time and sensed that I was dealing, not with one who belonged to the world of invisibility, but with one who could use an invisible state for a specific purpose. Tall by earthen standards, with a noticeable high forehead and eyes which were completely round and unlined, he stood there in a luminous type of space suit. On his forehead was a badge or insignia in the form of an eagle with outspread wings.

He bowed courteously and told me his name was Dionthus - this without any audible expression, for I found that, on receipt of his thought, I was readily able to transcribe it into word-form. Again he bowed courteously and left.

Following this, his visits became frequent and information was given as to the purpose behind the coming of those from outer-space and their part in a plan for the aiding and upliftment of their Earth brothers and sisters.

He also described to me life on his own planet, (which he termed), Achilles, which he told me lay in the Gemmic field beyond our Solar System. At times, there would be periods of silence as he travelled afield to explore Human conditions of life or to attend conferences, not only with Couriers from

other planets, but also with personalities from the Spirit World.

To me, it became increasingly clear that the coming of those from outer-space was part of an organised and directed programme, whereby Couriers from more evolved planets with greater technological awareness and higher spiritual standards were inter-mingling with the human race, and by a system of thought induction [telepathy], were endeavouring to enliven the human mind to a greater field of awareness in all forms of endeavour

Dartmoor - Another Area for UFOs

Over the years the south west has constantly been the scene of UFO activity, and the remote area of Dartmoor has featured among some of the best sightings. Do you remember some years ago when a police patrolcar chased a low level ufo along Moorland roads at 90 mph. Crewed by Constables Clifford Wayco and Roger Willey, the story made TV and headlines at the time. The fascinating 'Scoriton Mystery', subject of a book of the same name brought out all of the aspects related to ufology and may well have been the most significant UK incident to date. It too has passed from our memory while ufologist still repeat their unsuccessful attempts to fathom it all after 30 years of study.

Returning to Dartmoor, reports from a confidential source have reprinted a recent landing and encounter case from near Haytor. Unfortunately the witnesses drove away at some speed, so little is gained from the observation other than that a ufo landed on the road (a common technique now it seems) and a human looking man approached the car. At this point the witnesses made off!

Further reports from the same researcher read thus:
1st March 1974 - Mr H. Goldsworthy, a postman, stated, "I was going to work one morning, 5.50am; I saw a bright light in the sky which at first I thought was a star, but I realised that it was coming towards me. I stopped and then as it came nearer I saw it had flashing lights, about four. It eventually passed overhead and headed towards the moors. I know by the shape that it was not an aeroplane, and also there was no sound. I was in the RAF during the war and estimate that it was at about 5,000 to 6,000 feet."

4 June 1974 - My friend and I sighted a strange object in the sky. We were about ten miles from Princetown, my friend happened to look into the sky, for about 4 minutes we watched this strange object drift across then ascend till it was out.

of sight. We reported it to a policeman at Ipm, he took my name and address and said, if any more strange accounts were reported that afternoon they would get in touch with me. WE saw the object again later on, two jets were flying at the same height as the object. It seemed to glide across the sky not as fast as a jet, though it went up very quickly. We have tried to explain it with logic but found it impossible. The police came to my home that evening and seemed very interested.

29th May 1974 - Silver, motionless, oblong object seen in daylight from a driver on the Bere Alston Road, by the 'Harvest Home', near Gunnislake. A jet aircraft was also observed. The driver rounded a corner and trees obscured the view, after which he lost sight of the object.

May 1974 - Two people while driving in their car on the Tavistock Road, saw a large glowing object which stopped, and continued to hover over the road very close to them.

May 1974 - A courting couple in Haytor car park, were frightened by a low level UFO with two red flashing lights. The object passed over their car and flew towards the south coast.

You may recall the 'near miss' air liner sighting we reported in Fountain Journal No 8, 1977, which occurred on July 28th 77. Also many good sightings from the area appear in Robert Chapman's 'Unidentified Flying Objects', (Panther, paperback, 60p).

All this together with other reports we have published indicates that the Devon, mostly Dartmoor and South Devon, are rich in ufo activity, to say nothing of the more interesting events such as the Mrs Z case which we reported in No 7, 1977 Journal; When she was taken aboard also from a location in Devon, not far from Plymouth.

Exmouth, Torbay and vantage points on the Moors at Haytor, Princetown, Hatherleigh, Ermington and Buckfastleigh seem particularly favoured. * * *
