thumping we agreed that the noise had originated from the bonnet area of the car body, though there was an element of doubt. We discussed several possible causes. Soteris believing that it was due to car body strain or engine contraction due to cooling. However, the other two members of the party pointed out that the car had already cooled as it had been parked for 45 minutes on the rather windy hill and that the days motoring had not been excessive anyway. Chris remarked that in the  $2\frac{1}{k}$  years he had owned the car, he had never heard anything like it before.

Later in the evening, around 9.45, Chris spotted two UFO's while walking up the drive to Star House. They were bright star like objects travelling with tremendous speed, but were out of sight in seconds, before Andy or Soteris managed to see them. However, whilst looking for these, Andy ran to the forecourt of Star House at the top of the drive and looking straight up, caught sight of a large round faintly luminous UFO which was circular and about the size of a small soup bowl at arms length. It appeared to have the texture of a cloud and seemed to be pure white. Moving very fast it was out of sight in seconds heading towards the Cop Heap area, as were the others, one after the other.

Around I5mins later when other members of Fountain Centre were spotting from the Star House grounds, Chris sighted a third UFO similar to the first two, this time coming from the Cop Heap direction, but it was too fast for other watchers who were some fifty yards away to catch sight of it. A sky watch was held later on Cradle Hill but bad weather prevented any observations.

Chris who is shooting a private film on ufo's will be back for the new years eve sky watch, hoping for good weather and a close sighting.

# Sightings density over Warminster.

We take quiet a lot of 'stick' from the 'experts' over the number of sightings over Warminster so we thought we would detail the objects seen over two nights this summer of 76. We have contrived a new term; MSO meaning, moving star-like object, and we make no comment on what these may have been. Up to 38 of these MSO's have been recorded in one three hour sky-watch, this is not making any separation between man made earthorbital objects and extra-terrestrial orbital objects.

Statistically an average of two ufos have been seen each week during the last eleven years over Warminster hilltops. Sometimes just

a few degrees above the gaunt outlines of trees and scrubland or slowly meandering across the sky in a distinctive motion and sometimes in sight of skywatchers for twenty minutes and more when very low near slopes of hills have been bathed in the roseate glow of the aeroforms illumination.

Fountains - by Fred Hatcher.



ASTROLOGY EXFLAIMED - No. 2, More basics.


Apparent movement of the Stars.



Because the Earth rotates on its axis from West to East, the Stars, Sun, Moon, etc, appear to travel across the heavens in a counter direction, i.e. East to West. Polaris (the Pole Star) is so near to the North Celestial Pole that its position appears constant, always due north. The stars close to Polaris never disappear below the horizon in their apparent rotation about the Pole Star.

At any moment a perticular sign of the zodiac is rising on the eastern horizon and as there are twelve signs in the zodiac and the Earth rotates in 24 hours it follows that each sign takes 2 hours to rise before the parameter of the next sign appears. At the date of birth you have your Sun Sign, but by knowing the hour of birth the zodiac sign which was rising on the horizon at that moment can be calculated. This is known as your Rising Sign and it has as much influence in your life as your Sun Sign. You should find out your Rising Sign and read your stars for both signs in any forecast.

Left: Flatter, right: Dumbo, lower right: Quintain.




Above: Phases of the Moon.

The Moon revolves around the Earth in the same direction that the Earth rotates. During each of its orbits around the Earth the Moon rotates once on its axis. For that reason the same face is turned constantly towards the Earth.

At Full Moon we see the full lighted side of the Moon, whilst at New Moon only the dark side is towards the Earth and is difficult to see. The crescents of the Moon are not caused by the Earth, but are due to the angle at which we view it. A New Moon occurs at intervals of just over 29 days.

Arthurs book will be out on the 2Ist of November and there are two more on the way. Good luck with it Arthur we all hope it is a big success. It will be available through most book shops - paperback.

Well hello there all you sky watchers, its now winter season time and all you timid ones with the cold feet had better stay close to your firesides and not venture onto our back yard while we get a little work done. We have done a lot of survey work this summer and we have now classified sky-watchers into several

easily recognised types:

Type I: The gadget minded watch - can easily be notived by the absolutely amazing collection of junk which hangs about his person: This should include either a cheap plastiv camera or a very technical one which is too complicated for him to operate. It must always be loaded with a film which could also record 'the wife' featured standing in blazing sunlight in front of Longleat and also a pinpoint of light against a black sky. The best film for the watcher to use is a very slow colour film, thereby ensuring that no UFO appears on the negative hence giving rise to a good yarn that the UFO affected the camera. If the camera can be shaken when used, or set to 2ft 6inches (only for technically minded watchers who can measure) a suitably blurred, thats right blurred, image will be produced and halled genuine. Type IV: The scientifically associated watcher. He is never a scientist but always is heavily connected with some university research programme. He will first of all tell you that there is nothing in ufos and then proceed to back this up with detailed technical descriptions of complicated pieces of equipment like wet and dry thermometers which have proved they don'exist.
