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UK FLAP - CONTINUES

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Dateline: 30th December 1976 - 6.45pm

Mrs J and Mr T were travelling about 44 miles from Warminster when they saw an orange light in the sky. As they turned a corner they lost sight of it but around the corner the car started to rock and a high pitched whistle was heard. We now have a loss of memory by both persons.

The next they recall is being in a domed chamber about 15ft accross. In the room were three very human like people.

All the people were male, about 40 years old (by appearance) about 5'10" tall, wearing 'ski' type silver suits which were tight around the wrist and the ankles. All had normal hands, (five), and had no trouble in breathing as did the contactees. Their hair was 'sandy' coloured and long, down to the shoulder and turned up. The hair was swept back from the forehead, bar a few strands. Their faces were long and



white skinned. The nose was thin and long. Sideboards ended in a short beard also of fair sandy coloured hair. The eyes were of particular note. For they seemed to have a much wider optical range than the normal human eye. The pupil under low light conditions seemed to open wider than normal and to almost disappear, while under normal light conditions it could be seen operating in the normal way. The cornea was also more pronounced, giving the impression of a zoom capacity greater than in the normal eye.

The visitors spoke in an accented English, sometimes rather broken, but neither the less educated. The contactees were first asked to step seven paces forward and then seven paces back. Over this distance the temperature rose and fell.

In the centre of the room something red and black was rotating. One of the operators sat by some instruments which flashed on and off with a blue light. A number of messages were conveyed, the first being: "We are not hostile towards you." Also: "You must tell the World" and that the witnesses, "had strong tongues". This one assumes that the operator of the craft meant they would speak up rather than remaining silent.

There now follows a lapse of memory and the witnesses found themselves back in their car in a field by a river, near a farm track. They found their way home but came into town from a different direction to where they had been picked up. The car now has small marks on it which were not there before.

# THE STARS OF THE NORTHERN HEMISPHERE



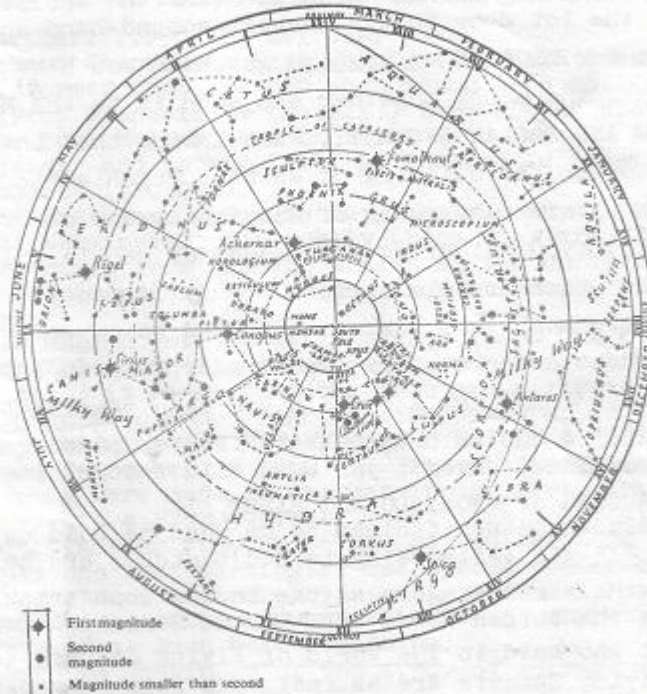
(According to a later system the apparent brilliancy of stars is expressed by decimal magnitudes)

The above is not a map of stars visible from any one place at any one time; it is merely a diagram of the northern half of the celestial sphere.

The heavens appear to be a rigid hollow sphere in which the stars are fixed, and with which they move round, the whole revolving about an inclined axis passing through the place where the observer stands. Since the pole of the axis of the celestial sphere is not directly above the observer's head, though the stars near the pole are always visible, those nearer his horizon pass for a time out of sight, i.e., rise and set. Similarly certain of the stars of the Southern Hemisphere rise above the horizon for shorter or longer periods according to their distance from the celestial equator.

# THE STARS OF THE SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE



(According to a later system the apparent brilliancy of stars is expressed by decimal magnitudes)

See note on the diagram of the stars of the Northern Hemisphere. The same general principles apply here.

The stars appear to form groups or constellations (though, in fact, the distances from the earth of individual stars in any group differ very greatly). The ancients gave fanciful names to the star patterns as Perseus, Leo (the Lion), Libra (the Balance).
