Editorial



Dog 'Froze' in Mid-air Several Seconds:

Top American newscaster Walter Cronkite is 100% convinced that UFO's exist, because of secret data revealed to him by space scientists and high-level government officials. The noted broadcaster bases his startling conclusions on:-

- (A). A bizarre spacecraft that hovered over a missile test site and beamed down "an eerie green ray" that froze a leaping canine in mid-air;
- (B). The earth -shaking sighting of a huge cylindrical aeroform by the crew of Apollo 9 on man's first flight to effect a moon landing;
- (C). A strange flying object observed by Astronaut James McDivitt as he circled our planet in a Gemini capsule;
- (D). Official air force reports of hundreds of UFO's which cannot be brushed aside as natural phenomena.

One of the most incredible cases, Cronkite confides, was told to him by a person of "Very high Authority" and concerned the amazing Andros Island incident. "It began when a radar operator at the site, about 150 miles east of the Florida Keys, noticed that the quiet night sky had suddenly turned a bright Green.

"He ran outside and, to his astonishment, sighted a huge cylindrical craft hovering above. He watched the missile site's mascot dog run towards the craft, barking and snapping angrily. The animal leapt into the air like an attacking cougar, but a shaft of green light was beamed down on the dog.

"The creature was locked into a frozen position by the ray, unable to move. The radar operator reported that the dog was there in mid-air for several seconds. Then the ray of green light was drawn back into the spaceship and the dog was dropped back to the pavement".

The man ran for his movie camera and shot eight minutes film, during which time "two more UFO's flew in and hovered over the first craft," said Cronkite. "Then the silent trio quickly sped off." After the incident, officials seized the 8 minute film and senior military officials flew in to "de-brief" the man who shot it.

Cronkite revealed: "Later, the man tried to see the film, but it had been confiscated. The dog and other animals on the island were removed by a P.T. Boat for possible radioactive side-effects. They also took samples from the many dead fish that washed ashore. Subsequently, the operator was told that what he had seen was classified information.

"Two other radar operators, assigned to monitor the tests on another nearby island, reported that their screens blacked - out for eight minutes, and they were transferred. Everything about that has been kept a total secret; and it is not the first time that this type of incident has occurred".

Footnote to this incident from Editor :- The Florida Keys area features strongly in the Disappearance of Flight 19 i.e. The Bermuda Triangle.

According to the trustworthy and popular newscaster, astronaut Neil Armstrong found that all his pre-flight training had not prepared him for what he was to encounter in outer space. "Aboard Apollo 9, enroute for the worlds first moon landing, Armstrong and his crew transmitted some earth-shaking information. And I was there to hear it for myself", the newscaster confides.

Armstrong claimed to have spotted a large cylindrical air form which was rotating or tumbling between their ship and the moon. It is officially recorded in the NASA record vaults that Armstrong indicated he went to take photographs, but the object vanished as quickly as he had first seen it.

"Neil Armstrong is not the man given to fanciful imagination and was not just one of the crew that saw it....They ALL did, and you have to respect those men. I know for a fact that when the Air Force recently turned over a serious of de-classified UFO reports to the national archives, there were still some 700 cases they could not explain away in natural terms."

Senator Barry Goldwater, retired Major-General in the Air Force reserve, told Cronkite that he believed the Earth had been and was currently being visited, "and is under observation by extraterrestrial intelligence. "And, vividly recalling an eyewitness account furnished him by a Columbia Broadcasting Executive, Cronkite says.

"He drew for me the outlines of a cigar-shaped object that he had twice seen near his Long Island summer home on the Atlantic coast. I respect this executive and I know that he was not trying to hoax me; he was telling the gospel truth. I believe him and told him that nobody has ever given me proof that UFO's are fiction. Many UFO's have been reported by our astronauts".

Now for the singularly startling case of a satellite that "came back from the dead" after seven weeks.

On 4th April 1965, the atomic energy commission launched the SNAP-10A into orbit from Vandenberg air force base, atop an Atlas rocket. It was designed to test an atomic powered rocket motor that the commission had developed as a power system for space travel.

Malfunctions of a satellite are not unusual, but they are supposed to be permanent. This particular one lasted precisely 43 days, after which it ceased to operate. On 16th May, after 552 revolutions of the Earth, all contact by tracking and telemetry instrumentation was lost; was severed completely with the SNAP-10A.

Then, on revolution 572 (22 orbits and 40hours later) the satellite reappeared... Data received back indicated that the reserve battery was being used. The command system was inoperative and the satellite refused to respond to ground commands sent to it.

The back-up AC power was lifeless. The reactor reflector was found to be ejected causing the reactor to shut down; and the converter power to drop down to zero. The altitude control system was out, this precluding the possibility of the satellite remaining on a steady course - or it should have done, for some unaccountable reason, the SNAP - 10A did not tumble, but maintained a steady course. How? Nobody knows.

Why the spacecraft resumed transmission after being "dead" for 43 days, and how it remained steadily on course after all its stabilising apparatus was knocked-out, was a mystery. It still is.

Who repaired the SNAP-10A ? Where did it go for over seven weeks?

SCIENTIFIC PREDICTION

September 1977 Report - Good witnesses

Friday 2.9.77. Seven members of UFOCENTRE, Torquay on a skywatch at Haytor Rocks observed a UFO at 10-30p.m. travelling from West to East when first seen. It changed to due South then changed to South East, heading towards Brixham. Blue flashing lights one red light central, blue lights seemed to circle object or object was revolving, object was observed for twelve minutes. No noise, unlike conventional aircraft. Difficult to estimate height.

Mr. Dale Kingsway Estate, Teignmouth, amateur astronomer observed the same object from his home. Neighbours Mr. and Mrs. Hill and son observed the object hovering circling losing height and climbing from 11-11.30p.m. over Brixham.

P.C. Scidmore Chudleigh came out of his house after breakfast his neighbours were standing looking up at the sky, he was curious, he saw the lights, his neighbours said it was not moving, he lined the object up with the side of his garage and it was stationary.

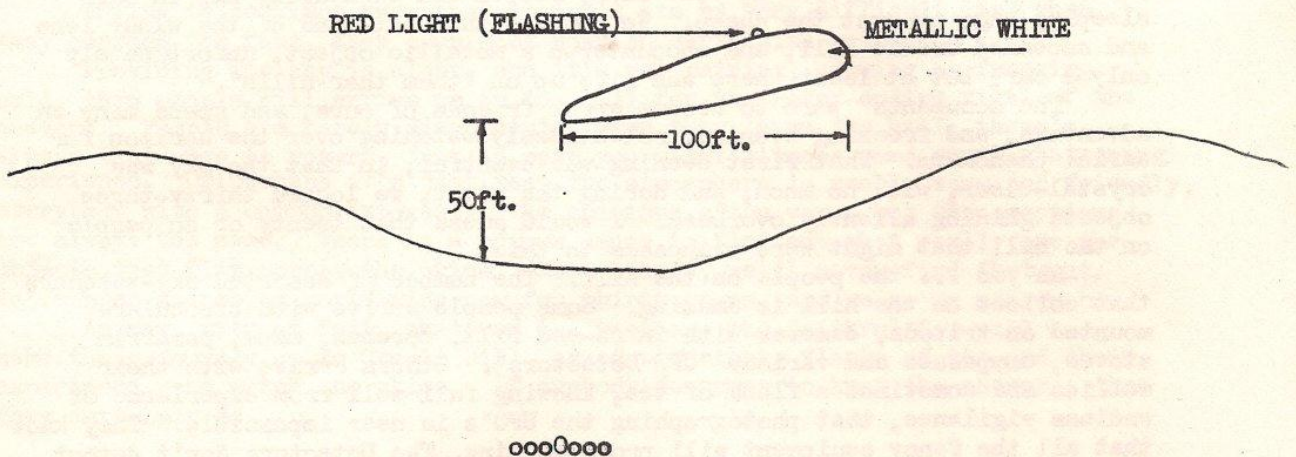
Daylight Sighting Near Warminster

On Thursday 9th February at 3.45p.m., two people travelling along the A350 from Shaftesbury to Warminster witnessed a white cigar-shaped UFO "hogging" the hilltops near Monkton Deverill. It was at first thought to be a crop-spraying 'plane but no wings or appendages were seen.

The manner in which it followed the horizon at precisely the same height also ruled out the possibility of a plane. It was undulating fairly rapidly.

The witnesses lost sight of the UFO and tried to catch another glimpse of it by driving up a hill. From the new position they could see for miles, but the UFO was gone. It had apparently, vanished

The object was roughly $\frac{1}{2}$ mile away and was metallic in substance making no noise. It may also be noticed that although there were no other cars or people about, a Police car was seen heading towards Monkton Deverill with the Policeman "looking upwards". The weather was excellent with a clear sky.



Is it - Or Isn't It Concorde

The above heading seems rather absurd, but we feel it portrays the scientific community's ability to explain away the mystery "Nine o'clock bumps" that have been heard in the South of England for the last twelve months. North Petherton appears to be the nucleus of the noise with roofs and windows being damaged at an alarming rate.

Questions we feel should be answered are:-

- 1) Why blame Concorde for the noise when both French and British Concordes have been grounded when it has been recorded?
- 2) Why have Bristol University planned another investigation after having "solved" the mystery?
- 3) How can we record and explain tremors on the moon, yet not in our "Back Gardens"?
- 4) If the facts are known, why the cover-up?

These questions are rather blunt, but they do need answering.

I shall never forget my first ever visit to Cradle Hill, Warminster, in the summer of 1976. I could never have imagined that that very first venture into a new "world" would spark off many more visits, often three or four nights on-the-trot, to the cold, unprotected hills of the little Wiltshire town.

I arrived at about 7.30pm on a Saturday evening with my colleague who was also on his first visit of this nature. As I was passenger, I could afford to stick my head out the window and look upwards the minute I saw Warminster signposted. We entered the town and I was amazed to see people walking around, not watching the skies, not staring out of windows at the clouds, not reading books on Flying Saucers, and not being involved in any pilgrimages up to the local hills. I could not believe how people, living and working under the antics of UFO's, could take their eyes from the skies.

When it struck me that Warminster was just another little town, we decided to ask which hill was Cradle Hill: and where else to ask, but a Police Station.

"Muggins!" was the reply from the duty Sergeant. No, there were only us two in the room, so he had to be referring to us. Anyway, he gave us the directions and assured us that we wouldn't be alone up on the hill. What's more we could drive there. That was welcome information, as we had prepared ourselves for a long trek up some muddy slopes and eventually kip in our sleeping bags amongst the sheep. We rounded the last bend of the windy lane and ascended Cradle Hill, and encountered a metallic object, unfortunately only a car, but at least there was life up on "them thar hills".

The "occupants" were to become great friends of ours, and spend many an adventure, and freezing evening, relentlessly watching over the horizon for aerial phenomena. That first evening was eventful, in that the sky was crystal-clear, with no moon, and during the night, we logged thirty-three objects gliding silently overhead. I would guess that twenty or so people on the hill that night were witnesses to this.

Ah yes ... the people on the hill. The number of assorted sky-watchers that collect on the hill is amazing. Some people arrive with binoculars mounted on tripods, cameras with infra-red film, torches, maps, paraffin stoves, compasses and various "UFO Detectors". Others arrive with their wellies and sometimes a flask of tea, knowing full well from experience of endless vigilance, that photographing the UFO's is near impossible. They know that all the fancy equipment will prove nothing. The Detectors don't detect anything, and their fingers are usually too cold to focus binoculars and track the UFO's. By the time they've located the torch to find the maps or compasses, they've lost the object, trying to find it again by following fellow skywatchers' pointed fingers.

"There it is moving ... moving away from us ... look ... just passing that star ... no ... that star. Look, see that bright star, well just follow it down to those two smaller ones, by that very faint one. Now move left ... Oh ... it's gone."

The times I must have heard people directing others to a faint speck of light, most probably a satellite, by using stars in the above manner. The majority of skywatchers have never heard of Cygnus, Bootes, The Pleiades or Andromeda. They needn't know every star or constellation, but a general knowledge of the sky really does help.

Of course, on the other hand, if some chap with a superior knowledge shouts out, "Look, just passing Betelgeuse! A light!" I know that happens to be a star in the system of Orion, but not everybody does.

Then you get the people who talk all night never once looking upwards, happy to drone on and on about all they've seen in their years of skywatching, telling you where they appear, when they appear, and what they do. Other veterans of Cradle Hill prefer to stand quietly, speak when spoken to, watching the skies and knowing what to expect. They've seen it all before and still experience the thrill of seeing the familiar "Amber Gumbler", an orange ball of light which has buzzed Warminster for years. These people are seasoned skywatchers, content to let people see and learn for themselves, and not be influenced or programmed by others.

Of course, there are newcomers nearly every week who are keen to learn the background of the UFO activity over the hills of Warminster and they do ask questions.

"Have you ever seen anything?"

"How many have you seen?"

"How often?"

"Whereabouts?"

Once you've admitted to seeing strange lights in the sky, you become a temporary hero. Parents often arrive with their children who hang on to your coat asking every question under the sun (or moon!). Then a car headlight appears on the invisible hilltop. The hills often blend into the black night sky and no separation is visible.

"Mum, look ... a Flying Saucer!"

Trying to convince them that it isn't can be very difficult, and when they concede the fact, they come back down to earth with a thud.

Providing the sky is clear, and it's not raining, snowing or freezing cold, then people will arrive up on the hill for the never-ending vigil of the heavens. People are rarely disappointed when they leave the hill, there's always that urge to return, just in case you might witness some earth-shattering experience. Or perhaps it's just that the atmosphere is really warm and friendly, everybody with a common interest. The opinions often vary, but the questions are always the same. There is a common cause to find out what really are the objects that flit across the skies. Most likely, we'll never find that out. We've been searching world-wide now for thirty years, and we're no nearer now.

Anyway, without fail, whatever the weather, the faithful few will make their journey up to Cradle Hill, armed with their flasks of tea and their experience, and watch the skies. If anybody deserves to know the answers, then they certainly do.

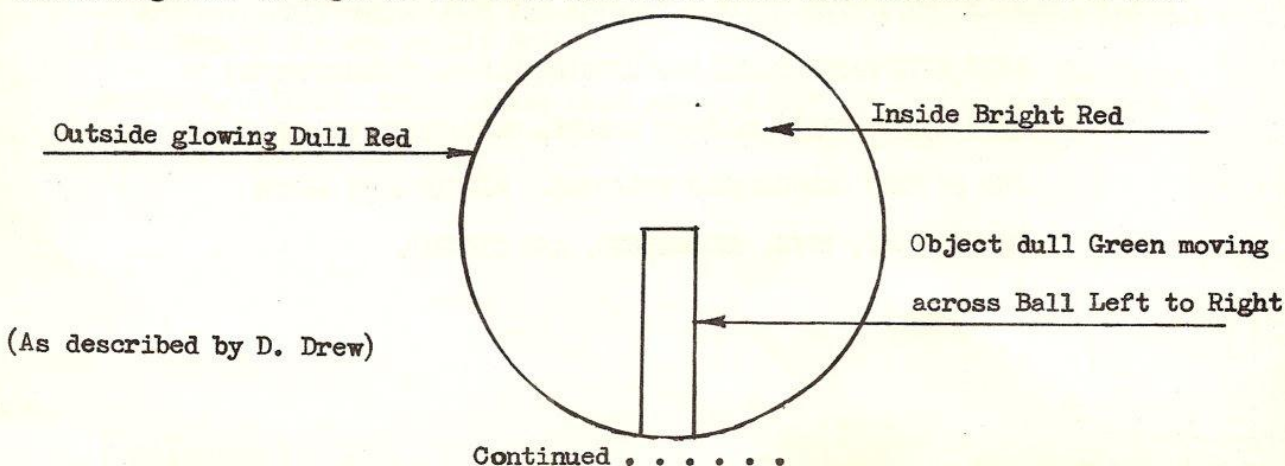
With the recent sightings which have been reported to the Press and Television I decided to question the men who saw these strange happenings. For some time now I myself have been interest in UFO's and at Cradle Hill and Cley Hill, Warminster from January 1977 saw more than one UFO. Especially around this area of Shepton Mallet, Wells, and Glastonbury but many people have not repoted them as not to be laughed at as such as many others.

Merehead Quarry is the largest quarry owned by Foster Yeoman. Where the latest sightings of the UFO's were seen was at some works where they make Forticrete blocks this is also owned by Yeoman and stands about a quarter of a mile on the edge of the Quarry itself. I have since January the 4th visited the Quarry several times and spoken to all the men concerned who have spotted the UFO's which all appeared in the early hours of the morning (midnight to 2.30a.m.)

The first man to encounter these strange sightings was a young man of 23 years of age Mr. Christopher Angel who drives the stacker for the works. I take up the story as told by the shift Foreman Mr. Derek Drew who said it was about (one) 1 a.m. of a morning in February or March of 1977 when Chris Angel came running into the main building of where the Forticrete blocks are made and shouted to him to come outside, on walking over to Chris Angel Derek said "What's the matter" and Chris Angel said "I am not working out there as there is somebody watching me," so they both went outside to the yard to where the stacker was and Chris said "I was driving the stacker at the back of the office block and just over the tip" (tip of stone dust for the making of blocks height 20 feet and extended 200 hundred feet at the back of the works), "When over the top of the tip appeared this huge Red Ball and to the eyesight two feet in diameter as I drove the stacker from right to left this Ball followed me and appeared in front of the stacker but in the sky, then I ran into the works to the Foreman." When both men went outside there was nothing at all in sight. It had completely disappeared. The second man to see the same object but months to follow is Mr. Steven Dymond who says that one particular night, the date he cannot remember, he was walking down to go behind the main block works when he looked up into the sky and saw this Red Ball and to the eyesight just over a foot in size, this was hovering over Asham Woods which runs alongside of the block works and yard, he says "I watched the object for some minutes and I could not make out what it was, it then moved over towards Yeoman's Quarry, and then hovered and disappeared."

The third man involved in these sightings is Mr. Bill Rowe who just before Christmas 1977 was stacking blocks with the Foreman Mr. Derek Drew in front of the main block works when the ground around them was suddenly lit up a yellowy kind of light, the Foreman looked up to Bill and said "It's getting very light" and Bill said "That's because of the lights on the stacker", when all of a sudden it went dark and they both saw a Ball of Light about a foot in diameter travelling towards Warminster direction.

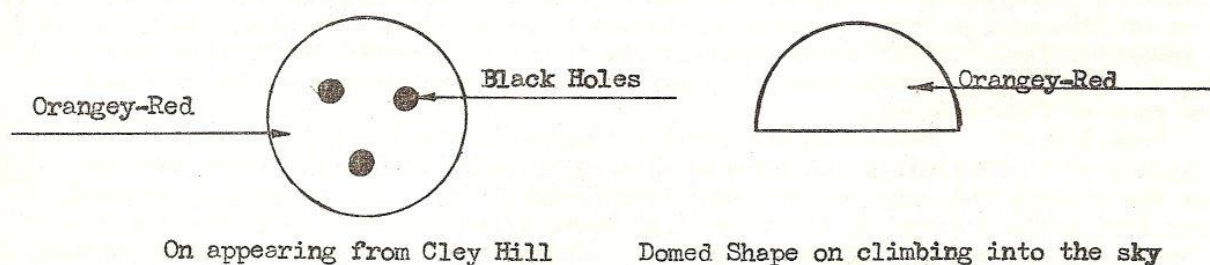
The fourth and final sighting was seen by Mr. Derek Drew who is Foreman at the works and says that in December of 1977 the date he cannot remember as to such, says "I was working out in the yard right of the main building when I had a strange feeling as if somebody was watching me, I looked up and saw this huge Red Ball over the tip and could describe the size of over two feet in diameter. I was puzzled at this object as it was glowing on the outside and red in the middle, and halfway up a piece coloured green which was moving left to right of the ball and which never wnet outside of it at all."



He then ran into the works to get somebody to witness what he saw and he got hold of Steven Dymond who came outside with him and the object had gone. While in conversation with Derek Drew who has told me that while out skittling one night some friends of his were pulling his leg over of what he had seen when a Mr. Harvey told him of about a fortnight before Christmas 1977 he and his wife were travelling home when they spotted a Dome-shaped object which turned into a Red Ball, now this happened at Witham Friary which is a matter of five miles from Merehead Quarry. Derek told me of several things that happened after his last sighting at the works, after he had got Steven Dymond out to witness of what he had seen the main lights went out and they had three main breakdowns in the works plus while Bill Rowe was driving the stacker he went to turn left and the stacker just went straight on. I asked if there was any malfunction with the stacker, skidding, steering etc and they all said no. The mechanical breakdown inside the works had never happened before, in all this Red Sphere has been seen at Merehead Forticrete Works five times up to Christmas 1977.

To conclude this story all the men concerned at these works have told me that they would not work there on their own, and especially beside Asham Woods, they all get the feeling that there is something or somebody watching them.

I myself believe in what the four men have seen because of my experience at Cley Hill of January 1977. Myself and a friend had been at Cradle Hill, Warminster until the early hours of this particular morning in question when we decided to make our journey homeward, we were just outside of Warminster on the Frome Road when I spotted an aura of light spread out on the left hand part of Cley Hill which faces Longleat Estate, as we drove nearer this light was now spread from the top of Cley Hill and onto the road, suddenly got smaller and disappeared and then as if coming out the side of Cley Hill and descending into the sky a huge Ball very orangey-red and the size four times that of the moon at its full, it appeared to have three black holes on the surface as in the diagram below.



On descending into the sky this Ball transforms its shape into that of a dome and completely disappeared before our eyes, and on further investigation by myself and my friend it was seen at Glastonbury December 1975 and at Shepton Mallet Christmas Eve of 1975.

I have also since these dates, in August 28th of 1977 described to the Press travelling across Shepton Mallet a Red Ball travelling from South to North and observed for five minutes after hovering and shooting off at great speed and disappeared completely as if somebody had switched it off.

My own feelings towards the Merehead Sightings is that these men have spoken the truth and recorded of what they have seen and any person on entering the Merehead Quarry in the late hours of any morning would see a different kind of world on entering this huge crater hewn out by man and lit by huge lights of which reflect the whitey coloured ground as at Cley Hill, and Cradle Hill, Warminster. From the air to any Alien it may look very mysterious and intriguing and to myself very mystifying as to why they should be interested in this part of Somerset.

The Clay Pidgeon Mystery

Recent investigations carried out by members of the UFO-INFO team drew some interesting conclusions when reports of UFO activity came to us from the Dorchester area. Sightings of strange lights in the wooded area around the "Clay Pidgeon" Motel on the A37 from Yeovil to Dorchester, roughly 10 miles from Dorchester itself.

The area itself is dotted with small villages and farm buildings, yet other lights were reported in and beyond the woods just off the A37. There was also a report of five orange lights appearing above a hedge and buzzing a lorry driver, but the investigations failed to see anything substantial. However, on the first trip down, two white lights momentarily appeared over the wooded area and blinked out after four or five seconds.

From the woods themselves the small village of Frome St. Quinton was visible, the lights of the buildings and streets shining through, but as the woods were so dense the village was only visible when illuminated. Daytime observation produced no results, with no signs of activity, e.g. burnt grass, broken trees, clearings in the wood etc, and everything seemed normal. If ever there was UFO activity in the region, then it is most likely over. At least half a dozen people saw lights which didn't belong there, but as to their origin that remains a mystery. I am sure that the witnesses will keep their eyes peeled and inform us if things start up again.

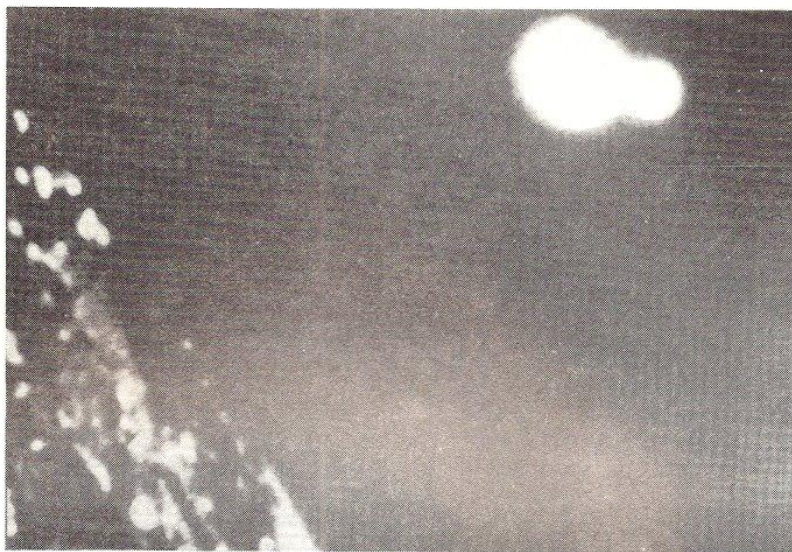

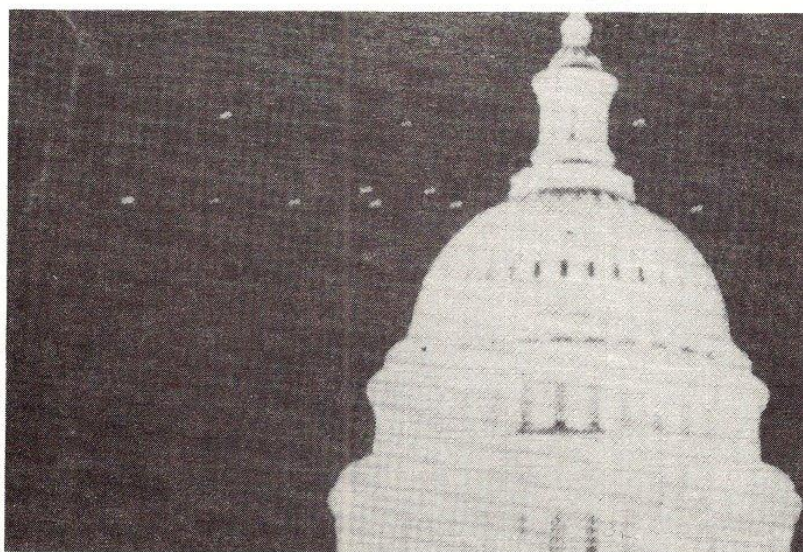

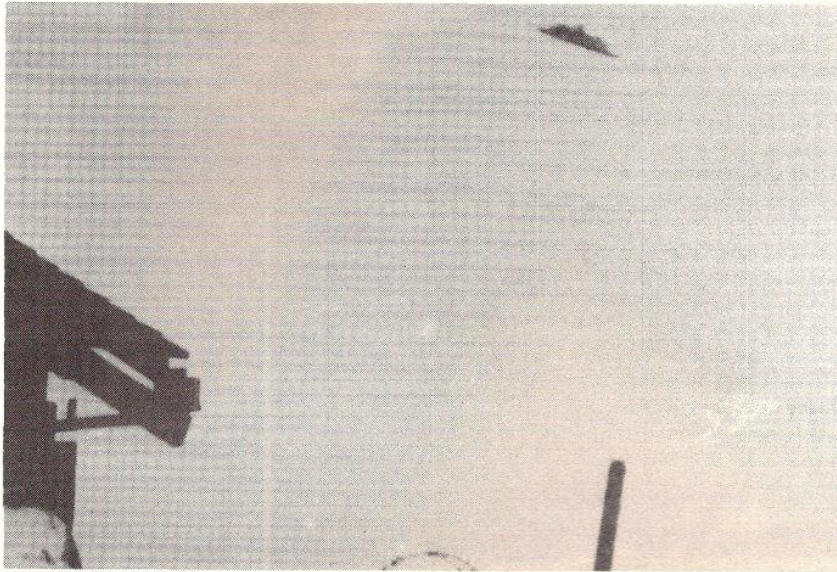

The sequence was filmed with a 16mm close-up camera from the Lunar Module "Eagle" at around 6p.m. on July 19, 1969, the day before the Apollo 11 landing on the moon. Note the similarity to the UFO's in the picture below, taken over the White House, Washington D. C. on the night of July 19th 1952. On analysis, the UFO's in both pictures were shown to be identical.
