On Cradle Hill...

Issue No 6 of the Warminster UFO Newsletter was certainly different from the usual format. The issue was devoted entirely to the assimilation of certain recurrences at Warminster and the interpretation thereof.

The particular issue reported the bi-annual pattern of growing activity which positively recurred on August 27th in 1965, 67, 69, and 1971. It led one to wonder what could happen on this date in 1973.

Certain number symbology had been revealed, namely the figure '9' through UFO appearances. On May 18th 1972 three, six then nine UFOs were seen to form the figure '2' in the skies over Warminster.

In issue No. 6 this Newsletter predicted that the figure '7' would be revealed shortly in the form of UFO sightings. In actual fact this 'prediction' was also a challenge - what ever intelligence was in amidst us on the night of July 15/16th certainly met the challenge.

The account of the actual skywatch written by Arthur Shuttlewood follows this introduction. There was a record number of persons on Cradle Hill this particular night, although very few were interested in recording what they were seeing. Not all the many watchers saw all of the UFOs. At least twenty witnesses were present at varying intervals to see most of them.

For the record, listed below are the dates and details of the sightings as we recorded them.

- 23:35hrs: Most of the watchers present by the white gates on Cradle Hill suddenly noticed an amber light hovering in the North over the area known as Long Wood. The light proceeded in a westerly direction toward Copse No. 2 gradually gathering speed, then slowing down and speeding up rising slightly on nearing copse No 1. It diminished in brightness, glowed brightly again and then faded to nothing before reaching the first copse atop of Cradle Hill.
- 23:45hrs: Most of the skywatchers saw a similar coloured light once again rise in the same position, follow the path of the first UFO, and disappear in the same manner in the same position. At approximately the same time another starlike light was seen much less brighter. This was Pageos A a satellite passing over the pole travelling south, its great height and distance making it appear to be going west.
- 00:14hrs: Seen from the white gate on Cradle Hill, a white star-like object almost directly overhead travelling from north to south. Disappearing two minutes later. This could well have been the Russian satellite Cosmos 395 which was traversing the skies between 00:06hrs and 00:11hrs from the north-east to the south-east at 30 degrees.
- 00:37hrs: Seen from the track just before Copse No 1. passing overhead a pale blue-white pulsating light moving North-west to South-East
- 00:45hrs: Seen from the field to the left of copse No 1. on Cradle Hill a starlike amber light overhead moving West to East, at the same time a silver starlike light moving east to west close to each other.
- 00:48hrs: Another silver starlike light moving overhead from north to south. At the same time a starlike white light moving south to north, again passing each other close to.

The Newsletter checked with the Space Department at Farnborough which tracks and records satellite passes and positions. One of the above sightings was of Pageos A and another possibly COSMOS 395. Although we expected and predicted the appearance in the skies of the FIGURE SEVEN, after evaluation, there does appear to have been SEVEN good UFO sightings that night.

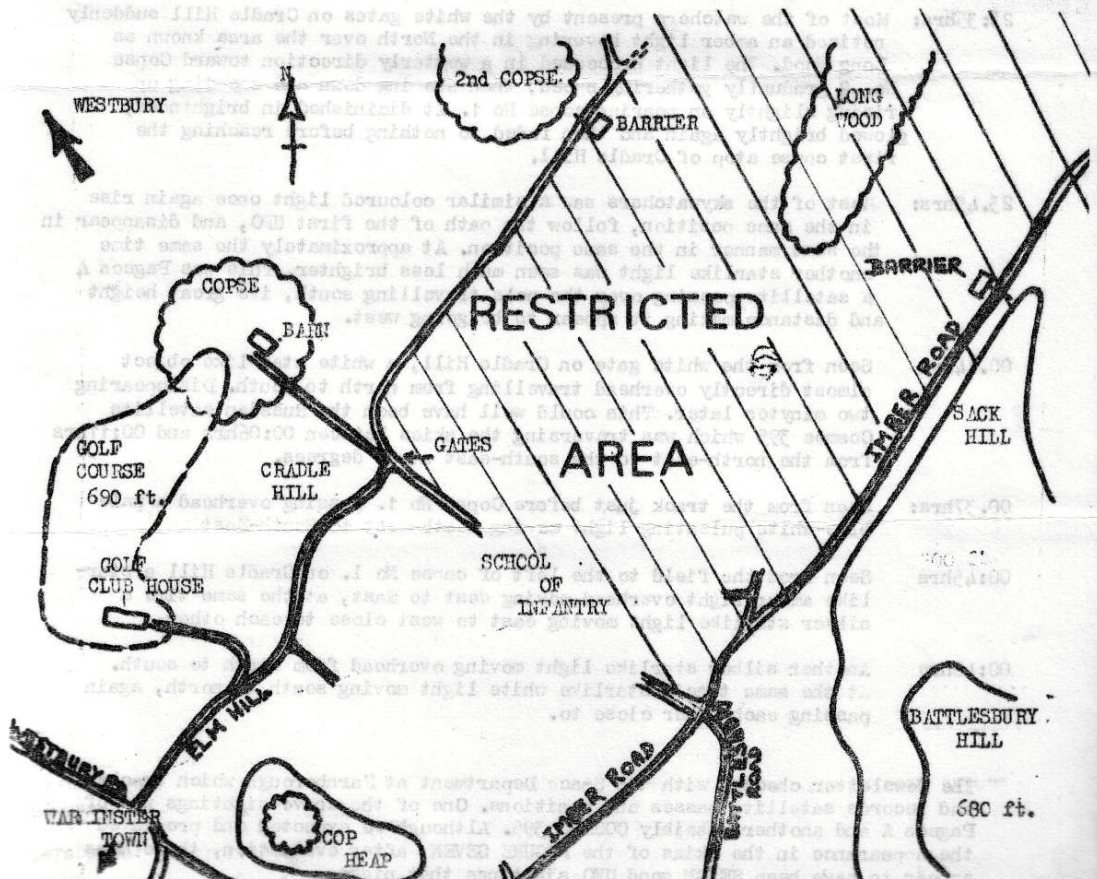
for visitors to cradle hill !.....

Following a security alert by the Army in Warminster (the Irish Rangers are at present stationed there) several parties of skywatchers have been turned away from Cradle Hill (which is on the perimeter of the School of Infantry) by police.

A representative from this Newsletter enquired at Warminster Police Station as to whether any more skywatches would be permitted.

Warminster Police have been extremely sympathetic in this case and have agreed that skywatchers may watch from Cradle Hill ON THE CONDITION NO ONE PASSES BEYOND THE WHITE GATES onto Army territory. Failure to observe this rule could render trespassers to security checks by the Army.

The Newsletter has already provided a litter bin on Cradle. Skywatchers are asked by the farmer Mr. Geoff Gale to kindly follow the Country Code.



There were 23 cars assembled on the approach road to Cradle Hill, Warminster, on the eventful night of Saturday, July 15th, in addition to a van and two motor-cycles. But, more importantly, over 100 people were present to see at least one genuine UFO that erupted into golden or amber growth and shape at around 23.20hrs, gliding sedately from the direction of Mortar Clump, near Starr Hill, towards Vedette Post 5 on the road leading to Copses 2 and 3.

A satellite? Almost certainly ruled out as an alternative because it swept upward in a distinct arc the more it progressed forward. A helicopter? Immediately discounted, for one hears a helicopter long before it hoves into view, at night. Also, UFOs make no sound, invariably; and this one gave not a purr or whisper of noise. Aircraft of any description were no possible substitutes so the only remaining possibility was a weather balloon.

This, too, was scotched, for the wind was blowing into witnesses' faces, whereas the aeroform kept its straight and fairly even course from right to left of the watching throng. Other possible UFOs were seen later that night and early Sunday morning, but not so near and distinctly. Yet the amazing thing, really, was not the appearance of the celestial chariot that failed to fit our conventions and concepts; more important was the fact that it was confidently expected by a few people on the ground!

At present it might be imprudent to give the exact source of a strange yet compelling message received by what one so-called UFO review terms, in unwarrantably contemptuous fashion, "the Warminster clique and cult." Suffice to state that the message conceivably came from our flying visitors themselves, signed "Valiant." It spoke of the significance of the figure 3, 9 and 7 - as hinted at in our No.6 Newsletter - and gave much more information that may prove invaluable in future to the patient, persevering and hoax-hating nucleus of local skywatchers. Valiant was asked to produce proof that he spoke truth: "test the spirit to see what fruit they bear," even as UFO intelligences have tested local research students many times in the past seven years.

Whereupon, Val said his own spacecraft would appear over Cradle Hill between 9pm and 12 midnight on Saturday, July 15th. We could announce this to the world. Knowing the attitude of the daily pressorgans, no attempt was made to do this on a widespread scale; but instead, one of the co-editors of the Warminster UFO Newsletter, Ken Rogers, went on Radio Bristol of the BBC and confidently forecast that anyone interested in the subject (probably the most important in our world today) was warmly invited to Cradle between 9 pm and midnight that Saturday; and would definitely see, not one, but seven UFOs totally inexplicable and unorthodox by our scientific and aerodynamic standards. His prediction came true; moreover, the viewing conditions that particular night were the most favourable for some time. Weather and sky were perfect.

If readers are interested, we can divulge other points from Val's communications in a future issue of our Newsletter. For the moment, it may be worth studying the few points here related: Note how many sightings are now taking the form of a triangle or pyramid. The three 7's referred to in Newsletter No.6 can all be contained in that shape. In addition, Valiant claims to hail from the Ell Race which started life on the Earth planet millenia ago. One can also place three L's within that pyramid or triangle. This is information which should strike a chord of half-forgotten memory to all those of the truly Adamic Race. There are many old souls occupying young bodies on Earth today...

It is expected that many genuine skywatchers will come to Cradle on Saturday, August 26th, staying until early hours of the 27th. It COULD be worthwhile!
